If working for a large employer (50+ employees), you have a right to:

Wisconsin farmworkers' rights

As a farmworker in Wisconsin, you have a right to:

- Minimum wage: \$7.25/hour (narrow exemption for certain interns)
- Receive pay at least monthly with a detailed pay stub
- Right of association: Join or form a union; engage in collective activity to improve conditions
- Receive overtime pay at 1.5 times the hourly pay rate for all hours worked over 40 in that week when performing duties that do not meet the definition of agricultural labor
- · Sanitary working conditions
- · Safe transportation, if provided
- · Safe and clean housing, if provided
- · Protective gear for pesticide application and training
- · Information in your language explaining:
 - Job duties, pay, place of employment (work location)
 - Costs you must pay: Transportation, housing, food, tools or work gear like boots and gloves
- If H-2A visa worker, payment of transportation, food and lodging costs

Wisconsin food workers' rights

As a food worker in Wisconsin, you have a right to:

- Minimum wage: \$7.25/hour (narrow exemption for certain interns)
- If tipped employee: \$2.33/hr (\$2.33+tips must=at least \$7.25/hr)
- · Receive pay at least monthly with a detailed pay stub
- Receive overtime pay at 1.5 times the hourly pay rate for hours worked beyond 40 hours/week
- Engage in collective activity to improve working conditions, which includes the right to join or form a union
